>>> LIBRARY HISTORY

Many Years Of Talking, Pleading, Labor Precede Library's Coming

The Franklin parish library demonstration was opened on December 11, 1950. There were few who did not know that it had taken many years of talking, pleading and labor on the part of library-minded citizens, some of whom did not live to see the realization of their efforts.

We've spent a little time digging through Franklin Sun editions throughout the decades. We found some interesting articles from the original push for the creation of the

Franklin Parish Library. Many stages occurred throughout the conception of the library but the official Franklin Parish Library in

Winnsboro was opened on December 11, 1950, the Wisner Branch was opened February 17, 1951, and the Hunter Branch was opened March 16, 1951 in the home of Mr. Leo Wilson.

Bookmobile service began soon after opening of the headquarters library. First a small truck was used because of a delay in delivery of a large bookmobile. The first bookmobile arrived on February 24, 1951 and served faithfully until it was replaced by a parish-owned one in March, 1958.

A history of the library shows a total of eight different homes for the three branches: for Winns-boro, the "little house behind Walter's store," the old telephone office, the Masonic Lodge building and the new Franklin Parish library; for Wisner, the "cook's house" owned by the E. P. Crawfords, and the present location in the Wisner city hall; for Hunter, the living room of the Leo Wilsons and the new location on Maple street in a duplex that houses a kindergarten.

Big Plans Made to Place Parish Library in Franklin

Miss Essac Martha Culver, executive secretary of the Louisiana Library Commission will be in Winnsboro next Monday, March 18, for the purpose of conferring with all who are interested in a local library. The conference will be held at the Methodist church here at ten o'clock on the date mentioned above.

Plans are now being perfected to make this meeting of parishwide interest. The purpose is to discuss ways and means of obtaining funds to establish a parish library, and. especially, to discover a source from whence enough pecuniary substance may be derived to make initial steps possible, thereby giving foundation to definite action.

All who are interested in the establishing of a library in this parish are urgently requested to be present at the date, March 18 and to add impetus to the move-

MEMBERSHIP IN **PUBLIC LIBRARY GROWS STEAD!**

Membership in the Franklin Parish Circulating Library has grown steadily since its inception two weeks ago, forty-four local book-lovers already having joined. Miss Agnes Bradley, who is in charge, hopes to make the library a parish-wide institution with a representative membership from all sections of the parish.

Miss Bradley announces that there are eighty late novels on hand at the library, and from two to four new books will be added each month.

The membership fee in the library is \$1.00 per year, and book rental is at the rate of 10 cents for four days, with a charge of 5 cents per day over time. Members residing outside of Winnsboro are permitted to keep a book one week for the 10 cents

The library is located at present in the Health Unit Building, and is open daily from 9 until 11 a m.
