







Thank you to everyone that took the time to create a design for our fun competition to help us celebrate serving the residents of Franklin Parish for 75 years!



Baskin Sextet Takes 126th Victory, Third Consecutive Class 'B' Title At State High School Tournament

Coach Willie Edna Tarbutton's Baskin High school sextet walloped Castor 71 to 32 to gain their 126th consecutive triumph and the third straight Louisiana class "B" championship in the finals of the state rally at Southwestern State college, Lafayette, Saturday night.

The Baskin lassies had little trouble in gaining the final round of play. The ward six sextet trimmed Start 49 to 13 in the preliminaries, clamped a hold on Pitkin 56 to 27 in the quarter-finals, walloped Haughton 81 to 47 in the semi-finals and trampled Castor in

the playoff.

In the semi-final contest with Haughton. Mildred Ragsdale, rangy forward kept the net hot with 56 points and scored 36 points in the Castor-Baskin fracas. Dixie Baskin, fast stepping forward, hit the net for 27 points in the final round.

During the past six years, the Tarbutton-coached team has won the state "B" championship trophy four times and placed second and third in the other two tournaments. They are Franklin's undisputed champs and five times winner of the Northeast Junior college district tourney.

Lost through graduation for the 1950-51 season will be two firststring guards and one secondstring guard, according to F. E. Liles, Baskin principal.

The team is composed of Mildred Ragsdale, Juanita Glass, Betty Fox, Dixie Baskin, Glenda Coronado, forwards; Pauline Rushing, Bobbie Jean Duchesne, Frances Deggans, Patsy Stephens, Johnnie Merriwether and Maudie Bradshaw, guards.




