LIBRARY NEWS & INFORMATION

>>> SERVICE SPOTLIGHT

The State Library offers specialized services to Louisiana residents of all ages who are visually impaired, legally blind, have reading disabilities, or are unable to handle traditional books through the Talking Books and Braille Library, a special library-within-a library.

An affiliate of the Library of Congress's National Library Service for the Blind and Print Disabled, TBBL provides access to more than 164,000 audio and braille books, 25,000 large-print books, and playback machines to anyone with permanent or temporary disabilities. Reader advisors help patrons select materials.

Additionally, TBBL dedicates a staff member to serve children up to age 18, allowing them to participate in statewide summer reading programs. There is no charge for TBBL, and more than 6,000 Louisianans use the service.

WISNER IS HIGH WINNER AT MEET HELD BY SCHOOLS

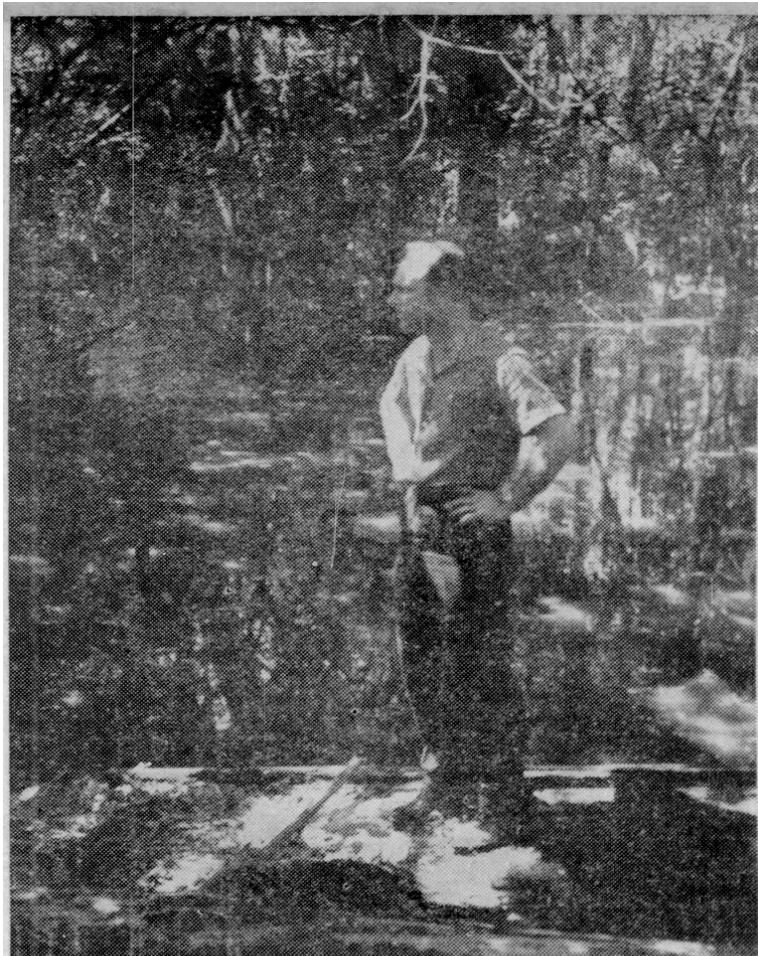
Crowville and Winnsboro Tied For
Second Place; Several High
Schools Entered

PLANS FOR NEXT YEAR ARE

Track and Field Meet Held On Wis-
ner's New Cinder Track,
Recently Completed

WISNER, May 2nd—The first annual Franklin parish track and field meet was held on Wisner's excellent cinder path, one of the best in the state. The following schools took part in the meet: Winnsboro, Gilbert, Baskin, Central, Ogden, Crowville and Wisner.

Wisner won the meet by a big score, the girls coached by Prof. S. B. Whittington, scored 27 points, senior boys coached by Zollie Bennett, scored 32 points, junior boys coached by Beverly Faulk, scored 23 points; Crowville and Winnsboro running neck and neck for second place.

MARINADE:

2 TABLESPOONS EXTRA VIRGIN OLIVE OIL

1 TABLESPOON LIME JUICE

½ TEASPOON CHILI POWDER

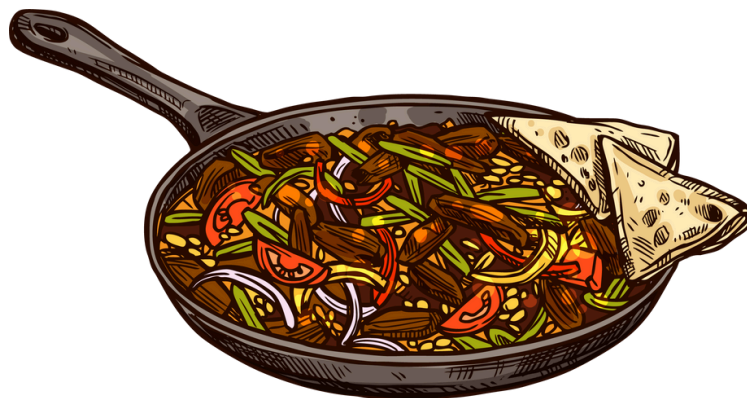
½ TEASPOON CUMIN

½ TEASPOON RED PEPPER FLAKES

¼ TEASPOON BLACK PEPPER

½ TEASPOON

SALT 1 CLOVE GARLIC, MINCED



PREPARE PROTEIN & VEGGIES:

1 TABLESPOON EXTRA VIRGIN OLIVE OIL

1 ½ POUNDS FLANK STEAK, THINLY SLICED ACROSS THE GRAIN

1 LARGE ONION, SLICED

1 RED BELL PEPPER, SLICED/JULIENNE STYLE

1 GREEN BELL PEPPER, SLICED/JULIENNE STYLE

OTHER FRESH VEGETABLES MAY BE ADDED, SUCH AS SQUASH & ZUCCHINI.

1. MIX ALL INGREDIENTS FOR MARINADE AND SET ASIDE.

**2. PLACE SLICED STEAK IN MARINADE – THIS CAN BE DONE IN A ZIP-TOP BAG.
REFRIGERATE FOR 1 HOUR.**

3. IN A SKILLET, HEAT 1 TABLESPOON EXTRA VIRGIN OLIVE OIL.

4. SAUTÉ ONION & BELL PEPPER AND OTHER VEGGIES.

5. ADD STEAK AND COOK ON HIGH HEAT FOR 3-5 MINUTES.

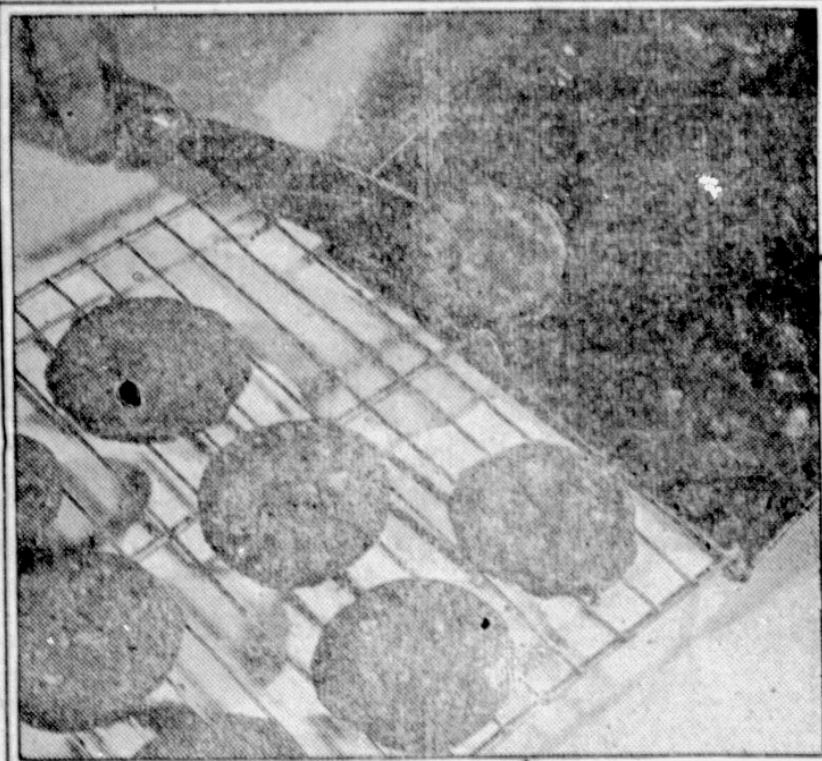

New Brazil Nut Cookie Recipes



Remove Butterscotch Cookies from Baking Sheet Shortly After Removing from Oven. Let Them Cool On a Rack.

THIN nut cookies are in great demand, particularly in homes brightened by young children. Running in and out of the house all day, burning up energy with every step, youngsters constantly ask for something to eat. Actually they need frequent "refueling". A new kind of cookie, crunchy and brown, is the treat of treats for them.

Butterscotch cookies are rich in energy elements as well as being delightfully flavored. There are a dozen and one ways to make them. But the liberal use of ground Brazil nuts in the recipe pictured as detailed below represents a pleasant departure from routine preparation. The nuts in this instance are an important part of the batter, not just something that is casually added. One caution to observe in baking is to remove them from the baking sheets before they have cooled and hardened.

Brazil Nut Macaroon Cookies

2 egg whites 1-4 teaspoon salt
1-2 cup sugar 1 cup ground
 Brazil nuts

Beat egg whites until foamy but not dry. Beat in sugar and

Brazil Nut and Butterscotch Cookies

1-2 cup butter	2 teaspoons
1 pound	baking
brown sugar	powder
2 eggs, well	1-2 teaspoon
beaten	salt
1 1-4 cups	1 1-2 cups
flour	chopped
	Brazil nuts

Melt butter, stir in sugar and mix well. Stir in beaten eggs. Sift flour with baking powder and salt, add nuts and stir into first mixture. Drop by teaspoonfuls onto a cookie sheet, greased with an unsalted fat, and bake in a slow oven, 325 degrees F., about fifteen minutes. Remove from pan after cookies have cooled half a minute.

salt gradually. Add ground Brazil nuts and drop by teaspoonfuls on an ungreased baking sheet. Bake in a moderate oven, 350 degrees F., 15 to 20 minutes, until light brown. Remove from pans at once.

Stuffed Mutton Chops: Wipe six French chops cut one and one-half inches thick and make slit in meat, cutting to the bone. Melt two tablespoons butter. Add one tablespoon chopped onion, one tablespoon finely minced parsley and cook five minutes. Add two tablespoons flour, one-half teaspoon salt and one cup well-drained crushed pineapple. Cook five minutes longer. Press this mixture into slits made in the chops and pin together with toothpicks. Lay chops in shallow pan, bake in hot oven (450° F.) twenty-five to thirty minutes. When partly done sprinkle with salt and pepper. Garnish with parsley.

Pineapple Meat Loaf: Mix thoroughly one-half pound chopped pork, one-half pound chopped beef, one cup drained crushed Hawaiian pineapple, three cups rolled cracker crumbs. Break in one egg. Work in three teaspoons salt and one-half teaspoon pepper. Pack into a bread pan and bake forty-five minutes in a moderate oven (400° F.). Serve hot or cold.
